
# Newsletter



Welcome to the first newsletter of the 2022/23 academic year. We were thrilled to learn over the summer holidays that we have been awarded the Eco-School Green Flag award. #### Summer Reading Bingo Challenge

#### New Library

This term we are working towards transforming our ICT (computing) suite into a dedicated library. ### **Ukulele Tuition**

We have managed to secure ukulele tuition for our children in KS2 (Classes 3 and 4) this term. This will be led by Mrs Berners, a specialist music teacher. Class 4 enjoyed their first lesson yesterday and are looking forward to learning a new skill.

# **PATHS (Promoting Alternative Thinking Strategies)**

This year, we have introduced the PATHS programme in school. The children in all classes will have PATHS lessons each week and during this time we will cover many topics including:

- Friendship
- How to recognise and understand feelings
- How to use and improve thinking skills
- Various ways to solve problems etc.

From next week, a different child in each class each day will be awarded PATHS Pupil of the Day. They will have special privileges on that day, and they will bring home a compliments sheet with compliments from adults, their peers and themselves. When your child is Pupil of the Day, please give them a compliment to add to their sheet.

# **Tapestry**

To further improve communication with parents, we plan on using Tapestry this year - an online learning journal for children in EYFS. Tapestry is widely used across the country and will provide parents with regular feedback about their child's progress.

#### **Christian Values**

Each half term, we focus on a different Christian value and this value permeates through the curriculum and our Collective Worship. Our Christian value for the first half of the autumn term is thankfulness, which links in nicely with our forthcoming harvest celebrations.

#### **Christian Vision**

Our Christian vision is 'Let your light shine' (Matthew 5:16) and we have recently asked the children to draw something that will help us to remember what it says and means. The children have produced some excellent drawings and we are in the process of deciding upon an image that will be used across the school to highlight and celebrate our vision.

#### **Times Tables Rockstars**

Please remember that the children have access to Times Tables Rockstars. We would encourage them to use this resource on a weekly basis as a sound understanding of times table facts is essential in becoming a successful mathematician.

#### Allergies

We have several children with nut allergies in school, therefore it is important that lunchboxes do not contain peanut butter or nut products. Thank you for your cooperation.

#### Water Bottles

It is important that the children are hydrated throughout the day, as being fully hydrated means that they will be able to think faster, be more focussed, and have greater clarity of thought. Please ensure that your child brings a water bottle to school each day containing water only, thank you.

#### <u>Uniform</u>

Please can you ensure that all uniform, including coats, is named so that lost items can be returned to their owners. Thank you for your cooperation.

#### **Wellbeing**

We continue to prioritise wellbeing for both pupils and staff in school. We recently appointed our new Wellbeing Ambassadors, Ella-Rose and Oliver, onto our School Council. I have also completed Senior Leadership Mental Health Lead training.

#### **School Council**

We recently held elections to appoint this year's School Council members and we were very impressed with the number of applications we received. #### **Out of School Hours Communication**

#### **Birthdays**

We know that many children enjoy bringing in cakes to share with their class on their birthday. If you are planning on sending a treat (no sweets please) in for the class, we ask that these are individual cakes, thank you.

#### **Volunteers**

We are very keen to welcome volunteers into school. We have several regular volunteers who come in to listen to readers, help on school events and trips etc. and we would like to expand our team. If you feel you have some time to spare, please let me know. We really would be grateful for any extra support.

#### PE Uniform

As we have continued to ask children to come to school wearing PE kit on the days they have PE, we would like to remind parents of appropriate PE kit. The children should wear the following:

- Plain PE t-shirt in the appropriate team colour, ideally with the Denver School crest
- For colder weather plain blue or black jogging/tracksuit bottoms, a plain blue or black long-sleeved warm top, socks and trainers
- For warmer weather plain blue or black shorts, plimsolls/trainers, socks
- For children with long hair, please provide a hairband so that hair can be tied up
- Jewellery, including earrings, should not to worn

We ask that children do not wear football tops or clothes with logos. Thank you for your support.

Clubs have resumed with the coaches from Alive King's Lynn Community this week. There are some spaces available in each of the clubs so please contact the office should your child wish to join.

#### **Bikeability and Bike to School Week**

The children in Class 3 received Bikeability Level 1 training from Outspoken Training on 8<sup>th</sup> September. Within the school grounds, the children learnt a range of valuable skills: how to check a bike and helmet for safety, how to correctly mount and dismount, how to make a range of turns, how to brake in a range of situations and how to signal your intended directions to other road users. The instructors were highly complimentary of the children's enthusiasm, manners and behaviour.

Year 5 children will be receiving their Bikeability Level 2 training in the week beginning 10<sup>th</sup> October. This will involve going out onto the local roads to test their skills.

#### **Active Kids**

The first Active Kids festival for our Year 1 children took place on 29<sup>th</sup> September. The children travelled to Lynnsport Pelicans AstroTurf to participate in a range of activities that develop fundamental movement skills relating to football, netball, squash and gymnastics. The event was a success, and two further sessions will take place in the spring and summer terms.

#### **Dodgeball taster session**

Children from Years 1 - 6 thoroughly enjoyed their dodgeball taster sessions today provided by a coach called Ryan from Wereham Village Hall. This was a welcome addition to enhance the competition aspect of our curriculum provision.

## Other forthcoming events

Other activities that will be taking place this term are the intra-cross country festival and there will be a cluster football tournament for Year 5 and 6.
