## Art in EYFS

Art forms part of the area of learning \& development Expressive Arts \& Design and within the ELG: Creating with Media \& Materials. It is also worth noting that EAD can also be found within other areas of learning such as PSED - where relationships are strong learners are likely to explore media \& materials, be inventive, which are all components of EAD. C\&L- learners will talk about what they have created; develop vocabulary. PD - fine motor skills, the control \& coordination of different tools. Literacy - talking about illustrations in books. Mathematics - includes shape, space \& measures as well as patterns \& spotting connections. UTW - 'artistic \& cultural' awareness.
