Art forms part of the area of learning & development Expressive Arts & Design and within the ELG: Creating with Media & Materials. It is also worth noting that EAD can also be found within other areas of learning such as PSED - where relationships are strong learners are likely to explore media & materials, be inventive, which are all components of EAD. C&L- learners will talk about what they have created; develop vocabulary. PD - fine motor skills, the control & coordination of different tools. Literacy - talking about illustrations in books. Mathematics - includes shape, space & measures as well as patterns & spotting connections. UTW - 'artistic & cultural' awareness.
