Geography in EYFS

Geography can be found within Understanding the World & the ELGs: People, Culture & Communities & The Natural World. It is centred around the learner's **knowledge** and understanding of the wider world and **community** around them. Through developing a sense of place, geography inspires a curiosity, **love of learning** and appreciation of the **environment**. Learners are equipped with knowledge of **diverse** places and people. Through exploration and **collaborative** learning, they develop **skills for life** in observing, communicating and comparing what they learn about the world around them.
