


January 2023 Newsletter


School Opening Hours

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To help keep you informed of your child's attendance, a letter will be sent out at the end of each half term for those children with an attendance of less than 90%, which is deemed as persistent absence.

Our overall school attendance so far this year is 95.5%, which is lower than our target of 97%. Please work with us to help improve attendance and ensure the best outcomes for our children.

Clubs

Following feedback from last term's parent questionnaires, we are looking to extend the extra-curricular clubs we offer as a school. Performance club resumed this term, and we also introduced our new 3.15pm Club. Mr Rackham has started a lunchtime computing club for Class 4, which is proving to be very popular. We are hopefully introducing a new music club, run by Miss Berners, after half term, along with a Forest Schools' club for KS1. Football club for KS2 will also resume after half term now that we have lighter evenings.

New 3.15 Club

At the beginning of this term, we launched our new after school club, the 3.15 Club and we have a number of children regularly attending. The club runs from 3.20pm-4.20pm each day and is open for children in all year groups. The children who attend take part in a variety of sports and art and crafts activities. Industrial Action

Parent Governor Election

Last week an email was sent out regarding the **two** vacancies we have on our Governing Body for parent governors. Governors are responsible for ensuring the strategic direction of the school, its performance and the use of resources to support learning. They help to ensure that our school provides the best education it can for children, parents and our local community. Being a governor is a very enjoyable and worthwhile, and we always look forward to welcoming new governors to the team.

Parent governors are elected by the parents or guardians of children attending the school. All parents or guardians of children attending the school are entitled to propose or second candidates and vote. Nomination papers for this purpose can be obtained at the school from the Headteacher. The completed nomination papers must be returned by Monday 20th February. If you would like any further information, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Weather

Although we have hopefully seen the worst of the winter weather, February can sometimes be an unpredictable month, so we wanted to remind you of our procedures for inclement weather. We always do our utmost to keep the school open, however, it may occasionally be necessary to close the school in really bad weather as several members of staff travel long

distances across Norfolk and beyond. If this is the case, regular announcements will be made on Radio Norfolk and Greatest Hits Radio (West Norfolk) soon after 7am. Bank Holiday - 8th May

- Tuesday 9 May: English grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS) papers 1 (questions) and 2 (spelling)
- Wednesday 10 May: English reading paper
- Thursday 11 May: mathematics papers 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)
- Friday 12 May: mathematics paper 3 (reasoning)
