## Newsletter



Welcome to the February newsletter. Spring is finally just around the corner, along with the longer days and better weather (hopefully!). Although February is always a short month, as you will see from this newsletter, we have been very busy in school and have lots to share with you.

## **Outdoor Learning**

Just before half term, we launched our outdoor learning programme with Classes 1 and 2. Outdoor learning is an innovative and engaging approach to outdoor education that aims to inspire children to learn and develop through hands-on, experiential activities in nature and provide opportunities for them to connect with the natural world. The children will initially have a dedicated outdoor learning session each half term during the school day, and we hope to weave further opportunities into the curriculum as the programme develops. We are also running an Outdoor Learning after school club each Wednesday for Classes 1 and 2, which is proving to be very popular. We have already received some very positive feedback from children and parents and the benefits are already apparent. #### **Safer Internet Day**

On Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> February, we celebrated Safer Internet Day to help promote the safe, responsible and positive use of digital technology for our children. The children all took part in activities exploring ways to keep themselves safe online in their computing lessons.

## **Children's Mental Health Week**

We recently engaged with Children's Mental Health Week, which ran from 6<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> February. The theme was Let's Connect and aimed to encourage children and adults to consider how they can make meaningful connections that support our mental health. The week started with a special assembly on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> led by Louise Ramsey from the Swan Youth Project. The children all engaged in activities throughout the week to help them to develop the knowledge, skills and values to support their own and others' mental health and wellbeing.





## **New Library Update**

Our new library is almost finished now, and I am sure you will agree that it is looking fantastic. We received confirmation last week that we were successful in winning the Tesco Community Grant award, contributing £1500 to the project (many thanks to everyone who added the blue tokens into our slot) and The Friends have also generously offered to donate £1660 towards purchasing some of the items. A huge thank you to everyone involved in its creation, in particular Amanda Dawson and Michelle Caul-Byrne for spending many hours adding the new books to our library system, Michelle Maynard for art work, Angela Williamson( one of our TAs) who has been working hard to get all the books on the shelves, and to our amazing librarian, Allison Alves, who has dedicated a significant amount of her own time to making the new library such an inviting and inspiring space. #### **Outdoor Reflection Area**

Over the past term, we have been working with a local family, the Burton family, to create an outdoor relfection area in our living willow on the school field. The Burton family raised over £2000 to create a memorial to members of their family who have attended Denver VC Primary over the years, and we thought that an outdoor relfection area would be very fitting. With their generious donation, we have purchased a bench and some planters and we are hoping to also add a bird bath. We hope to complete this project soon so the children can enjoying using the reflection area in the better weather.





#### **Eco-Committee Update**

The Eco-Committee would like to organise a waste-free Wednesday on 8<sup>th</sup> March to cut back on the amount of waste and single-use plastic we use in school. They want the children to bring in packed lunches which do not contain any single-use packaging. We will also ensure that school lunches are packaging-free. More details to follow.

The scheme runs from Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> April right through until Monday 17<sup>th</sup> April and is free for all families eligible for benefits related free school meals. #### **Bishop Stephen's Lent Challenge**

This term, we will be participating in Bishop Stephen's Lent Challenge, the theme of which is Live Life Full this Lent – 'I have come that you might live life in all its fullness' (John 10:10). The children will be exploring what make their lives and that of others full, and what we might need to do to ensure we lead a full life.

## **Mother's Day Posies**

Each year, the children make posies in school to present to their mums on Mothering Sunday. The ladies from St Mary's Church have once again kindly offered to help prepare the items needed and the School Council will purchase the flowers. I know the children always enjoy making the posies, and I'm sure our mums enjoy receiving them.

#### **Tax-Free Childcare**

We are now set up as an approved childcare provider for our paid for before and after school clubs. This means we can accept payments through the Tax-free childcare system if parents are eligible. To help keep you informed of your child's attendance, a letter will be sent out at the end of each half term for those children with an attendance of less than 90%, which is deemed as persistent absence.

Our overall school attendance so far this year is 95.7%, which is lower than our target of 97%. Please work with us to help improve attendance and ensure the best outcomes for our children.

#### **Industrial Action**

The next National Education Union industrial action is being held on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> March. Once again, we have plans in place to provide sufficient cover for all our classes and therefore we will be open as usual.

Each half term we focus on a different Christian value in school, and our value for this half term is **hope**. This value will be explored in collective worship as well as in curriculum time and the children will record examples of hope in action in their floor/class books.

#### **Courageous Advocacy**

Courageous advocacy is the act of speaking out against an issue of injustice, often on behalf of those whose voice is not heard. We have recently been gifted a special trophy from Ely Diocese to be awarded to an individual child or group of children at the end of the school year who have demonstrated courageous advocacy.
