A group of children from all classes had been working hard with Amanda Dawson and Michelle Caul-Byrne to learn some maypole dancing which they performed to the children and parents.

#### KS2 SATs

Between 9<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> May, the children in Y6 took the KS2 SATs tests. As you are probably aware from the media coverage, the papers this year were quite challenging, particularly the reading paper. However the children were calm, focussed and all tried their very best and we are very proud of them!

#### **Great Cressingham Visit**

Yesterday, Class 4 became Victorian scholars for the day when they visited the Victorian School at Great Cressingham. Here is an account of the visit from Mrs Henden:



The children arrived to the sound of the bell tolling the beginning of the school day. After greeting their teachers for the day (Miss North and Miss Samson), they were separated into gender groups to enter the school building.



Many interesting activities followed: hymns and prayers, Victorian style; reading, writing and arithmetic lessons and close-up science/art observation lessons. We learnt many Victorian sayings: 'Time is the enemy,' 'Practise makes perfect,' and 'If at first you don't succeed, try and try again!'





It wasn't all work! Playtime allowed the children to learn how to spin tops, roll hoops, use kaleidoscopes, play wooden quoits, use Zoetropes, flick books, use skipping ropes and many more novel skills...







After a traditional packed lunch, Victorian style, and endless complaints about the tin cups of water (!) there were more things to discover. The boys closely observed and drew scientific objects while the girls sewed lavender bags. After a final handwriting lesson using dip pens and blotting cloths there was a closing hymn and farewell.



This was a brilliant experience. We are truly grateful to Miss North and Miss Samson who provided the experience, the Friends of Denver School who funded the coach, the parents for providing amazing costumes and Miss Cronin and Miss Loveridge for supporting the visit. What a day! One that we will treasure for years to come.

#### Outdoor Learning Update from Mr Cawley

Outdoor learning has been a fantastic success, with all children benefitting from seeing our school field in a different light! The children have created lots of interesting creations from willow, with our largest project to date being the fire pit and live willow fence. They have also made willow head dresses with wildflowers, bug hotels using chicken wire and helped build a fence for Reception using tools (under supervision of course!). They have problem solved moving and siting the new bird table, and they have made Sistrum musical instruments.

Yesterday the children planned and modelled making a spherical dome using a variety of different circular items; this was as an exploratory lesson for a potential whole school project that will hopefully materialise in the second part of the summer term... watch this space, parental help will be welcomed!

In each newsletter we have an attendance focus as part of our continued work to improve school attendance. Please remember that any absence from school has an impact on learning, as is exemplified in the table below. Please remember that holidays in term time will not be authorised.

Please discuss any planned absence, including for holidays, during term time, with the class teacher. A leave of absence form **must** be completed at least two weeks prior to the absence, the link for which should be requested by emailing the school office. Please remember that, in accordance with our policy, a penalty notice fine may be issued for holidays taken in term time.

To promote good attendance, we celebrate the class with the highest attendance each month. May's attendance figures were as follows:

Well done to Class 2 for having the highest attendance for the month of May with an impressive 99%!

To help keep you informed of your child's attendance, a letter will be sent out at the end of each half term for those children with an attendance of less than 90%, which is deemed as persistent absence. Our overall school attendance so far this year is **95.7%**, which is lower than our target of 97%. Please work with us to help improve attendance and ensure the best outcomes for our children.

We also monitor children who arrive at school late. Please remember that any child arriving at school after 9am will receive a late mark. If a child arrives after 9.10am, this will result in an unauthorised absence. Letters will be sent out to parents/carers if there are concerns about punctuality to school.

#### **Waste-Free Wednesdays**

Our waste-free Wednesdays have been continuing this term and we have been really pleased by the number of children bringing in packed lunches which do not contain any packaging. This initiative will continue after half term.

#### **Out of School Hours Communication**

#### **Christian Value**

Each half term we focus on a different Christian value in school, and our value for this half term has been **tolerance** and after half term it is **endurance**. This value will be explored in collective worship as well as in curriculum time and the children will record examples of endurance in action in their floor/class books.

To protect the children from the sun, please ensure that they bring a sun hat and water bottle to school each day, and that they apply sun cream before coming to school. Thank you.
