Technology Day by Mrs Henden

On Tuesday 23rd January, eager learners in Class 4 were joined by Alan Culley, Bryan Bradley and Martin Chilvers from Downham Market Rotary Club for their new Junior Technology Challenge, 'War is Brewing'.

The challenge was to imagine being back in 1540 with the following scenario: Invading forces are approaching, and the King sends a messenger who must return with 300 men as reinforcements within 2 days or be executed. The messenger comes across a piranha infested river with a dilapidated crane in the centre. With a limited number of resources, the messenger must think of ways to successfully get himself and his army across the river.



Small groups used their imagination and the physical resources provided by the Rotary Club to explore and create a portfolio of different ideas. These were scored against the specific criteria outlined at the start of the task. The budding engineers produced some excellent and very inventive ideas.

The technology day was to enrich the children's learning in the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) subjects. Rotary Technology Tournaments are one day events involving an unseen challenge to develop team building and communication skills, planning and time management skills, and give them an opportunity to apply their skills. The aim of such events is to inspire students to consider careers in these areas. This was certainly the case at Denver as the children rose to the challenge and had a fantastic and memorable learning experience. Children's Mental Health Week

We will soon be engaging in Children's Mental Health Week, which this year is running from 5th - 11th February. This year's theme ***My Voice Matters*** is about empowering young people to use their voices, share what matters to them, and encourage those around them to hear their voices. We are having a special assembly on Monday 5th led by the Swan Youth Project. The School Council and our wellbeing ambassadors are planning to create a dedicated space for wellbeing using the outside shelter and each class will be involved in its creation. Throughout the week we aim for the children to develop the knowledge, skills and values to support their own and others' mental health and wellbeing.



School Pets

Continuing on the theme of wellbeing, the School Council members have expressed a wish for us to have school pets to support their mental health and teach them about responsibility. After much discussion, we finally agreed that guinea pigs would make great school pets. We have already had a parent generously offer to sponsor this project, but we would be really grateful if anyone has a spare hutch or any resources, food etc. that we could make use of. Outdoor Learning Club Update by Mr Cawley

The first outdoor learning club was a very chilly session! Leading into den building later in the term, we were learning the basic knots to hold two pieces of rope together, as well as an easy-to-undo lashing. What better way of learning how to tie a knot, than to be a knot! The children really enjoyed climbing over and under each other to replicate the instruction 'right over left and under, left over right and under'. Once this visual was mastered, we progressed to using string to make a chain of knotted loveliness! We finished the session with a lashing, which taught the children that there are other ways to fix things which makes it easier to undo. The children had an excellent time, in a very cold hour; the one day we needed gloves we couldn't wear them!



Office News

Absence

If your child will not be in school for any reason, it is really important that you let us know as soon as you can, preferably before our attendance register is taken at 9am. Even if you have passed on a verbal message at morning drop off, please also let the school office know so that they can mark the register accordingly and pass the information on to the relevant class. You can do this by emailing absence@denver.norfolk.sch.uk (preferably) or ringing us on 01366 383272. Please leave a message on our voicemail if it is before the school office opens. If your child has diarrhoea and/or vomiting, they should be absent from school for 48 hours from the last bout of sickness.

Holidays

Please remember that holidays during term time **will not be authorised** and may be considered for a Fixed Penalty Notice should the criteria be met (**9 sessions or 4.5 school days of unauthorised absence within a 6 school week period**). An absence request should be completed **before** any holidays are taken and can be accessed by requesting a link from the school office. It is important that we are made aware of children taking holidays before they are taken, rather than once children are on holiday as is sometimes the case.

School Lunches

If your child is in KS2, not eligible for free school meals, but would like to have a school lunch, **please send online payment in advance and at least by the Friday morning of the week in which they were taken**. This avoids the build-up of money owing and reduces time spent chasing for payment. Lunches are currently £2.35 each.

If you are struggling to pay for school lunches but would like your child to have one at lunch time, you may be entitled to claim for free school meals. To check if you are eligible, please click the following link and follow instructions: [Free school meals - Norfolk County Council](#)

Sandwich Option

From February half-term, we will be trialling a new system to encourage children to try our delicious hot school lunches. Every day we will be offering a main hot meal or a jacket potato option, but the sandwich option will now **only be available on Tuesdays and Thursdays**. The menu will remain the same.

Correspondence and Communication

Please can we ask that you check emails and Class Dojo regularly to ensure that you are aware of important messages such as clubs being cancelled etc. Thank you for your co-operation.

Out of school hours you can contact the school urgently, for example with a safeguarding concern, by using the dedicated email address worried@denver.norfolk.sch.uk. If you are worried about something, please do contact the school via this method and a member of staff will get back to you as soon as possible.

Attendance Focus

We are continually working hard to improve school attendance due to the impact that absence from school can have on learning. As part of this work, each newsletter throughout the year has had an attendance focus.

Please remember that, in line with the expectations set out in '[Working Together to Improve School Attendance](#)', fixed penalty notices will be issued if the criteria set out in that letter is met.

To promote good attendance, we celebrate the class with the highest attendance each month. January's attendance figures were as follows:


Sports News
