I have included a *frame* for the children to draw a portrait of either Samuel Pepys or King Charles II. If they have time they could also write a recount about the event. When was it? Where did it start? Why did the fire spread so quickly? How did they stop it from spreading?

### **Science and Literacy**

The children are writing their own non-fiction text about the weather, linking their literacy and their science. I have sent a template to support their writing. They have learnt about the different features and should write about their chosen weather type.
