Parent Consultation Evenings

SIAMS

The school received a one day SIAMS Inspection (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) on 30th January. The principle objective of a SIAMS inspection is to evaluate the distinctiveness and effectiveness of the school as a Church school, and how well the distinctive Christian character and ethos of the school ensure the development and achievement of the whole child. I am pleased to say that we received a Good judgement. The report can be found on our website.

Bishop Stephen's Lent Challenge

During the second half of the spring term we have been engaging with Bishop Stephen's (Bishop of Ely) Lent Challenge. This year it is built around 'The Five Marks of Mission', also known as the '5 Ts': Tell, Teach, Tend, Transform and Treasure. Each week the children have been undertaking a different challenge to show our commitment to observing Lent.

Denver Sluice

Tamsyn and Liz from the Environment Agency visited Class 4 to discuss flooding and the importance of Denver Sluice in preventing flooding in the local area. This supported their geography topic for this term, 'Rivers'. The children were set a competition to name the new gates at Denver Sluice. The standard of entries for the new gates was very high, although Paige was announced the winner. She had chosen the following names for the three gates: Pirates Gate, Mucky Porter Gate and Farmer's Boy Gate. The judges were impressed by how the names were based on old Fenland stories and the relevance to the local area. Sky and Kieran were also highly recommended.

Safety on the Railway

On 21st February, two Railway Enforcement Officers visited from the Safety on the Railway Campaign. The children all received goodie bags and an important message about keeping themselves safe near railways.

Football/Netball Tournaments

The school has been represented in both cluster netball and football tournaments this term. Both teams performed well and enjoyed the opportunity to play against other schools.

Active Kids

A group of children from Class 2 took part in their second Active Kids Festival at Lynnsport. The festival was aimed at engaging children in games/activities with three main themes: targets, creativity and being adventurous. There will be a final session in the summer term.

Dance Festival - King's Lynn Corn Exchange

On Wednesday, 7th March, over 400 children from primary schools around West Norfolk strutted their stuff on stage in the King's Lynn Corn Exchange. The audience of children

and 200 members of the public, clapped, sang and cheered as each school performed their dance routine. There was such a diverse range of styles: tap, street, rock and roll - even Gangnam Style! The Denver Dance Troupe went on towards the end of the festival and danced their socks off to 'Faith' by Stevie Wonder and Ariana Grande! They had never danced on the stage before and certainly to no more than 3 audience members but it didn't faze them at all and



they just took it all in their stride... whilst Miss de Vanche and Miss Waters hid in the wings! Well done girls and thank you for all your hard work - you have made us all at Denver School very proud!

Hockey

The children in Class 4 have received some hockey coaching from a member of staff at Wisbech Grammar School. They will use the skills they have been learning when they attend a friendly tournament against a range of other schools at Wisbech Grammar School later in the term.

The performance is for the parents/grandparents of children in Class 4. A further performance will take place at the King's Lynn Corn Exchange in July, details to follow at a later date.

The children once again enjoyed celebrating World Book Day by coming to school dressed as different book characters.
