Parent Information Sessions

Thank you to those parents who were able to attend the Parent Information Sessions this week. I hope these sessions have been beneficial and provided the opportunity for you to meet the teachers and ask any questions. As this is the first time we have offered such sessions, we will be sending home letters to all parents who attended asking for their feedback. All children in Class 3 will also attend an OMNES Games event out of school throughout the course of the year.
