School Holidays

Please make sure that your children read over the summer holidays. Six weeks is a long time for young children who are just beginning to read or gaining in confidence and we do not want them to forget what they have learned. Sharing stories together also motivates children to want to read and gives them the opportunity to develop preferences. Older children should read whatever it is they enjoy - fiction or non-fiction and books or comics. All of these will serve to improve their reading and hopefully their comprehension too if you have time for discussions. There will be a Library Challenge again this year with appropriate rewards for perseverance and the children will be introduced to it by a visiting Librarian later in the term .

Younger children would also benefit from having a small amount of money to spend so that they get used to adding up and working out how much change they will receive - as well as becoming familiar with coins and their value. We often forget the importance of this these days when we increasingly use cards to do our shopping. Making shopping lists will also help children to practise writing skills such as letter formation and recording sounds they hear in words. This is important to develop early Literacy.
