Welcome to the February newsletter. Spring is nearly upon us and it has been lovely to see some sunshine over the weekend. As we move towards a greater sense of normality in school, you will see that there are many forthcoming events for the children to enjoy.

Covid-19 Update

Since our return from the Christmas break, we have had a number of positive cases of Covid-19 in school, both with children and adults, and I would like to thank everyone in the school community for supporting the enhanced measures we put in place to address this.

Following the government's announcement regarding the recall of the remainder of the Covid-19 legislation last week, I would like to give you an update on what this means for our school.

The public health guidance that has been in place over the last 2 years will remain until the end of March. The principles of hands, face, space and fresh air remain key to infection control and we will continue to ask people to act responsibly by staying at home and away from others if they have symptoms or test positive for COVID-19.

Regular asymptomatic testing in mainstream education and childcare settings is no longer recommended by the government. However, while test kits are still available, staff will continue to test twice weekly.

There is no requirement for face masks to be worn in school settings, although we support those members of staff who continue to do so.

From 24th February, there is now no **legal** requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. However, public health advice remains that adults and children who test positive should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days. To continue to keep the school community safe, we ask that this public health advice is followed. If you are at all unsure of what to do if your child tests positive, please contact the school for further advice.

Christian Value

Each half term we focus on a different Christian value in school, and our value for this half term is **compassion**. This value has formed the basis of many of our discussions in collective worship and the children have been recording examples of compassion in action in their floor/class books.

Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised

This week we have started using a new phonics scheme, Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised, a complete systematic synthetic phonics programme (SSP). It is based on the original Letters and Sounds which we have been using previously in school, but has been extensively revised to provide a complete teaching programme meeting all the expectations of the National Curriculum, the Ofsted Deep Dive into reading and preparing children to go beyond the expectations of the Phonics Screening Check.

All children in Classes 1 and 2 will receive a daily phonics session. In addition to this, they will have three reading practice sessions each week.

School Vision Update

We will be working with the school community this term to explore this Christian vision in action.

Discover

Our school vision is '**to seek to discover and celebrate what is good in each individual**' and our key values are **Discover, Value, Celebrate** and **Praise**. Before half term, we requested that the children bring in photos to show what discover means to them, or them discovering something to illustrate our vision in action. A huge thank you to everyone who has so far sent in photos; these will soon be added to our vision display in the school hall. If you are yet to send in photos, please do so in the next few weeks so these can be added to the display.

Children's Mental Health Week

We recently recognised Children's Mental Health week (7th – 13th February) in school. To mark the occasion, during our normal wellbeing assemblies, the children watched a special online assembly organised by Place2Be and starring well-known children's entertainers. This year,

the theme was 'Growing Together'. The assembly explored emotional growth and development. Children were encouraged to imagine they had support balloons and to think about who and what helped fill that balloon. They were then encouraged to think about how they themselves might be in someone else's support balloon to show care and empathy for others. The next stage was to think about how goal setting can help us to move forward and out of our comfort zones to achieve new or better things. This was related to setting goals for our emotional growth such as being kind or taking responsibility.



Parent Governor Election

As you will already be aware from the letter sent out last week, we have **two** vacancies on our Governing Body for parent governors and we are seeking nominations of parents interested in taking up this role. Governors are responsible for ensuring the strategic direction of the school, its performance and the use of resources to support learning. They help to ensure that our school provides the best education it can for children, parents and our local community. Being a governor is a very enjoyable and worthwhile, and we always look forward to welcoming new governors to the team.

Parent governors are elected by the parents or guardians of children attending the school. All parents or guardians of children attending the school are entitled to propose or second candidates and vote. Nomination papers for this purpose can be obtained at the school from the Headteacher. The completed nomination papers must be returned by Friday 11th March. If you would like any further information, please do not hesitate to contact the school.
