


# June 2022 Newsletter



Welcome to the penultimate newsletter of this academic year. June has been another very busy month in school and here is a snapshot of the many events and activities the children have engaged with.

## **Commemorative Platinum Jubilee Book**

Early in June the children all received a free commemorative book to mark Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee. Designed as an official once-in-a-lifetime commemoration of the Platinum Jubilee and written in collaboration with royal experts and historians, the book tells the story of a young girl, Isabella, visiting her Great Granny Joyce who tells her about the Queen and this year's Jubilee. We hope the children enjoyed reading the book and they will keep it as a souvenir of this historic event.



## **Batteries**

A huge thank you to everyone who brought used batteries to school to be recycled. We collected more than 500 in total! These were taken to the local recycling centre at Crimbleham. Thank you for helping us to achieve another of our targets towards becoming an Eco-School.



### Class 3's Visit to Norwich Castle

Here is Charlotte's account of Class 3's visit to Norwich Castle: On the 17<sup>th</sup> June, Class 3 went on a trip to Norwich Castle. We learnt about Ancient Civilisations, including: writing, philosophy, farming and building. First we went to a room with seats and a projector and learnt about farming. Then we saw the tools they used and learnt how to use them. Then we left and did some writing. We learnt about some different languages such as Egyptian. We used a wooden stylus and blue-tack to write a word in Phoenician. Next we had lunch, then we headed to another room and learnt about philosophy and how everyone had different opinions. We finished the day in the room we started in where we built a small city as a group and organised objects into how old we thought they were. Overall, it was a great trip!

### West Norfolk Beekeeper's Association Visit

There was a real 'buzz' in their air on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> June when Jill and Kev from West Norfolk Beekeeper's Association visited school to deliver an interactive presentation to all classes about bees. This visit was arranged to enrich our science curriculum about life processes, and to contribute to our Eco-Schools application. The children learnt about different varieties of bees, got to try on beekeeper suits and look at an observation hive which contained a nucleus of bees and a laying queen. The children really enjoyed learning about these wonderful little creatures that do so much important work. A huge thank you to Jill and Kev for giving up their time to share their knowledge of bees with the children.



### **Big Norfolk Holiday Fun Scheme**

Big Norfolk Holiday Fun is a summer holiday activity scheme run by Active Norfolk in partnership with Norfolk County Council for children aged 5-15. Activities run from 25<sup>th</sup> July until 2<sup>nd</sup> September and include sport, drama, cooking, music, arts and crafts, dance, and much more. A free lunch is also offered. Activities are available for all children and **free** to those eligible for means-tested free school meals. If you don't claim free school meals, you could still get a free place. These places are for children needing extra support such as those with a social worker, looked after children and young carers. If you think this describes your child, please ask for an awarded place by emailing [bnhf@norfolk.gov.uk](mailto:bnhf@norfolk.gov.uk). Booking is now much easier and Big Norfolk Holiday Fun codes are no longer required. Parents will be asked to add their child's school when booking so eligibility can be checked. ### **New IT Equipment**

Over the half term break, our desktop computers in the ICT suite were replaced by laptops which are stored on a laptop trolley and transported to each class to be used in both computing lessons and other areas of the curriculum. We also had three new interactive whiteboards fitted. The children are really enjoying using the new laptops and feedback from the children has been very positive indeed.



### **Library Project**

Now that we have freed up space in our current ICT suite, we plan on transforming this space into a dedicated library to help promote reading in the school. We want to ensure that the library is an inspirational place for the children to spend time in and further enhance their love of books and reading. Obviously this will come at a cost and we are looking for local businesses who might be interested in getting involved either with donating items, time, skills or money to help make the vision a reality. ### **Summer Reading Challenge**

This year the Reading Agency and Norfolk Libraries are teaming up with the Science Museum Group for a very special science-themed reading challenge, Gadgeteers. The challenge this year is being brought to life by top children's writer and illustrator Julian Beresford. Gadgeteers will feature amazing books, awesome rewards, and plenty of ideas for cool experiments and activities. Downham Library will be hosting lots of exciting events and fun things to do throughout the summer and we'd love our children to be part of it. As always, it's FREE to join. The children need to read 6 library books to collect smelly stickers along the way to achieving a certificate and medal. Fran Valentine from the library will be visiting school next week to talk to the children about the challenge.

### **Downham Market Foodbank**

Downham Market Foodbank is a project founded by local churches and community groups, working together towards stopping hunger in our local area. It is located at The Eternity Church on the Trafalgar Industrial estate in Downham Market. They have been running as a foodbank for nearly 10 years and there to offer help, not only emergency food, but also a helping hand in other ways too. ### **British Values**

Throughout this half term, the children have been learning about the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs. They have been discussing how these values are promoted through everyday school life.

## **Attendance**

Schools must aim to have the highest attendance possible for all their pupils in order for them to achieve their maximum potential. An attendance below 90% is regarded as persistent absence. We recognise Covid-19 has had a huge impact on attendance this year, although we need to work together to ensure that all children attend school regularly, unless they are too ill to do so, to ensure that their learning is not further impacted. Please remember that holidays during term time will not be authorised.

To promote good attendance, in each newsletter will now share the class attendance figures for the month and a class certificate will be given. June's figures are as follows:

## **10 Minute Shake Up**

To help children to move more, feel good and have fun this summer, Better Health has teamed up with Disney to create some fun 10 Minute Shake Up games inspired by some of their favourite characters from Disney and Pixar's Lightyear, Disney's Encanto and Frozen, and Marvel's The Avengers. We recently sent out the 10 Minute Shake Up leaflets and we hope these activities will help the children to reach the recommended level of daily physical activity of at least 60 minutes.

## **PE Uniform**

A polite reminder that PE uniform should be plain, in school colours and without logos. Football tops should not be worn. We are noticing an increasing number of children coming to school in incorrect PE uniform, therefore here is a reminder of what is appropriate:

- Plain PE t-shirt in the appropriate team colour, ideally with the Denver School crest
- For colder weather — plain blue or black jogging/tracksuit bottoms, a plain blue or black long-sleeved warm top, socks and trainers
- For warmer weather — plain blue or black shorts, plimsolls/trainers, socks
- For children with long hair, please provide a hairband so that hair can be tied up

### **Sun Protection**

Please remember to send your child to school with a sun hat to help protect them from the sun. Sun cream should also be applied before coming to school. Thank you.

## Sports News

### **Quad Kids**

On 14<sup>th</sup> June, a team of 10 Year 6 children travelled to Lynnsport to compete against other schools in the West Norfolk area. The event was called Quad Kids and focussed on 4 fundamental athletics skills: endurance, sprint, jumping and throwing. The team comprised of five boys and five girls. Each had to take part in all four disciplines and then a team relay. Scores were pooled to create a final team score. The team performed incredibly well, especially in the endurance run which is testimony to the impact of the Golden Mile. They finished in second place and are rightly very proud of their medals. Once again they showed excellent behaviour and sportsmanship throughout the tournament. Well done!



### **Ultimate Frisbee**

Friday 24<sup>th</sup> June saw a group of Y3/4 children compete in the OMNES Games Ultimate Frisbee event at Lynnsport. The whole class had already had an Ultimate Frisbee taster session earlier in June. The team really enjoyed taking part and it was great fun to watch. We were very proud of their attitude, ability and teamwork. Sonny said, 'We played very well as a team, winning 5 games, drawing 1 and lost 1. It was such good fun.' Ella-Rose said, 'We had to play against a year 6 team who were twice as big as us!'



## Sports Day

On Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> June, we held our Sports Day and what a fantastic day we had! The sun shone and we were so pleased to be able to welcome our families back to spectate for the first time in 3 years!

The afternoon began with the KS1 inclusive carousel of activities. This allowed the children to experience a range of non-competitive events that explored fundamental movement skills. The activities included Tri-golf, the water race, the dressing-up race and the foam javelin. They also participated in these track events: egg and spoon, quoits, skipping and running. The Class 4 children were fantastic leaders, running each event and keeping the scores.

Immediately after was the KS2 traditional sports day. The children did a sprint, a skipping race, hurdles, the ball and bucket race, the egg and spoon and a house team relay. Then the winners of the throw and jump competitions that had been held in PE lessons were involved in a final face off to earn points for their team. Again, the children in Class 4 did a fantastic job of ensuring that everything ran very smoothly and that people were encouraged and supported.

Children across both key stages earned points for their house teams. The overall winners were once again the White team with a very impressive 199 points. Well done to all the children, regardless of their team, for their sportsmanship and for being willing to have a try.

A huge thank you to Mrs Henden and Miss Cronin for organising the event, and to the children in Class 4 for being fantastic sports' leaders.





### **Area Sports**

After a three-year break due to Covid, the Downham Market Cluster Area Sports event for Key Stage 2 finally resumed. In past years, schools competed as a team in the small schools and large schools events. This year there were 8 teams in attendance so it was decided that the children would compete individually for medals in their respective events, rather than as a schools competition. Medals were awarded for first place only. The following events were held for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6: hurdles, endurance, sprint and a mixed team relay on the track; long-jump and vortex howler throw on the field. There was also a tennis ball throw for Years 3 and 4. The children all represented the school very well and there were also many individual successes which is especially impressive when up against some much larger schools from the area. It was a pleasure to take such an enthusiastic and sporting team. Well done to everyone!
